

Minutes of the Environmental Public Hearing in connection with the Andhra Pradesh Industrial Infrastructure Corporation Ltd (APIIC) has proposed to establish an Mega industrial Park at Kopparthu village of Chinthakomma Dinne (M), Yadavapuram, Tollaganganapalli villages of Vallur (M) and Ambavaram, Rampathadu villages of Pendlimarri (M) of YSR District on 04.08.2017 at 10.00 a.m.

In accordance with the Notification No. S.O. 1533 dt. 14.09.2006 of Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India, New Delhi, the Environmental Engineer, Andhra Pradesh Pollution Control Board, Regional Office, Tirupati issued a notification pertaining to the Environmental Public Hearing on the Andhra Pradesh Industrial Infrastructure Corporation Ltd (APIIC) has proposed to establish an Mega industrial Park at Kopparthu village, Chinthakomma Dinne Mandal, Yadavapuram, Tollaganganapalli villages, Vallur Mandal and Ambavaram, Rampathadu villages, Pendlimarri Mandal, YSR District in leading newspapers published on 03.07.2017 inviting suggestions, views, comments and objections of the general public and the same was conducted on 04.08.2017 at 10.00 a.m and the minutes of the meeting are as follows:

The following Officials attended the Environmental Public Hearing :

The Environmental Engineer, A.P. Pollution Control Board, Tirupati welcomed the Joint Collector, YSR District and Public gathered at the Public Hearing venue and explained the need to conduct Public Hearing for the proposed project as per the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Govt. of India, New Delhi notification 2006.

He also explained as per the Terms of Reference (TOR), Ministry of Environment & Forest, Govt. of India, Dated 23.05.2016 it is necessary to get the public hearing conducted for this project and to take further necessary action for obtaining the Environment Clearance in accordance with the procedure prescribed under the EIA Notification 2006. Then he requested the Joint Collector, YSR District to take over the proceedings of the Environmental Public Hearing.

The **Joint Collector**, YSR Dt & Chairman of the Environmental Public Consultation while speaking on the occasion informed the importance of the Environmental public hearing to the public. She requested to express their views, suggestions and objections if any on the Environmental related issues only, so as to record and submit the same to the Govt. of India for taking further necessary action. She also requested the project proponent to explain salient features of the proposed project for information of the public.

Smt. A. Jaya Lakshmi, Zonal Manager, APIIC, Kadapa welcomed the gathering. While speaking on the occasion informed to the public that APIIC is proposed to establish a Mega industrial Park at Kopporthy village, Chinthakomma Dinne (M), Yadavapuram, Tollaganganapalli villages, Vallur (M) and Ambavaram, Rampathadu villages, Pendlimarri (M), YSR District at an extent of 6553.04 Acres. The Mega industrial Park is being developed to facilitate and to establish all Red, Orange and Green category of industries. Out of total acquired land of 6553.04 acres M/s APIIC proposed to use 2973.77 acres is plotted area, 203.36 acres for common facilities, 56.15 acres for commercial area, 216.93 acres of area is existing water tanks, 897.76 acres for developing roads, 694.62 acres as open space and 1510.45 acres for developing greenbelt. APIIC is proposed to

allot the land and facilitate 28 Nos of line of activities of industries in the Mega Industrial Park as mentioned in the REIA. She also expressed her faith that, the proposed project will improve the socioeconomic condition of surrounding area thereby improving the economy of State and the country.

Then, she requested the Environmental consultant of the project to explain technicalities of the proposed project for the reference of the public.

Then **Sri. Vamsi Krishna**, Environmental Consultant of the project, M/s Hubert Enviro Care Systems (P) Ltd, Chennai, while explaining the salient features of the proposed project on behalf of the proponent of the project informed to the public that the proposed project of Mega industrial Park at Kopparthi village, Chinthakomma Dinne (M), Yadavapuram, Tollaganganapalli villages, Vallur (M) and Ambavaram, Rampathadu villages, Pendlimarri (M), YSR District at an extent of 6553.04 Acres with a proposed project cost of Rs. 1305.75 Crores.

He also informed that they have collected base line data from 10 km radius around the project site to assess the impacts arising from the proposed industrial activities. The observed pollutants were within the limits as per National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). The Mega industrial Park proposed to facilitate 28 Nos of line of activities of industries.

Water requirement for APIIC is 250 KLD during construction phase and 35150 KLD for industrial and domestic use. Fresh water requirement is 30515 KLD. Recycled water to be used for utilities is 4635 KLD. Water requirement for green belt is 21501 KLD which will be met from recycled water. Fresh Water requirement will be met from Adinimmayapalli Reservoir located at 8.2 km away from proposed park.

He also explained that, APIIC proposed to construct Common Sewage Treatment Plants (CSTP) -2 Nos. for treating the Sewage generated from various industries, and also proposed to construct Common Effluent Treatment Plants (CETP) – 4 Nos followed by Reverse Osmosis (RO) & Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) to treat the effluents generated from the respective industries located in MIP.

He also explained that, APIIC proposed to treat Rejects from RO in Multiple Effect Evaporator of MIP. Salts generated from MEE will be disposed to TSDF. Treated wastewater from CSTP will be used for green belt development/Toilet Flushing within MIP premises and treated effluents from CETP will be reused as non potable water for various applications. He further informed that the APIIC is proposed to spent an amount of Rs 370 Crores towards Environmental Management Plans to mitigate pollution problems on surroundings.

Then The Joint Collector & Additional District Magistrate, YSR District requested the general public to express their opinions/ suggestions, objections, if any, on the proposed project, so as to record the same and will send to the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Govt. of India, New Delhi for taking necessary action.

Sri C. Janardhan Reddy, r/o Kopparthu village while speaking on the occasion informed that Govt. has taken over their lands of an extent 50 acres for development of MIP, so far Govt. have not paid any compensation to their lands stating that the said lands have been classified as dot lands. He also expressed his un-happiness on the amounts paid by the Govt. towards compensation i.e, Rs.1,14,000/- for DKT lands and Rs 2.0 Lakh for Patta lands. He finally brought the following suggestions to the notice of public hearing panel.

1. Requested to enhance the compensation to the land losers from Govt.
2. Requested to establish pollution free industries in the Mega industrial park.

Sri R.Obul Reddy, r/o Ambavaram village while speaking on the occasion informed that Govt. has taken over their lands of an extent 40 acres belonging to 6 people from their family for development of MIP, so far Govt. have not paid any compensation to their lands as the said lands have been classified as dot lands.

Meanwhile, the Joint Collector, intervened and requested the public to express their views on Environmental point only, the issues related to land acquisition will be discussed later.

Sri. Y.Obul Reddy, r/o Thadigotla village while speaking on the occasion expressed his un-happiness on payments paid by the Government towards land compensation. He requested the management to provide suitable jobs for the land losers and also requested to make sure that pollution free industries may be established in the Mega Industrial park.

Sri. K. Siva Reddy, r/o Diguva Palli, expressed his un-happiness on non-payment of land compensation by the Government even after repeated requests made by them.

Sri. I.M. Subba Reddy, r/o Thadigotla, expressed his un-happiness on non-payment of land compensation to DKT lands which were in his enjoyment before the land acquisition.

Sri. K. Lakshmi Narayana Reddy, r/o Kopparthy, while speaking on the occasion informed that there are 2 irrigation tanks adjacent to the MIP and requested to take utmost care to protect this irrigation tanks from pollution problems. He requested to enhance the compensation to the land losers and also requested to provide good number of jobs to the local people who lose their lands during land acquisition.

Sri. C. Janardhan Reddy, r/o Koparthy village again take the opportunity to speak on the occasion and requested to clarify the details of individual industrial units to be established in Koparthy industrial park.

Sri. K.Ashok Kumar Reddy, r/o Koparthy village while speaking on the occasion after verifying the industries with various line of activities (28 Nos) proposed to establish in Mega industrial park and expressed his apprehensions on the establishment of some of industries viz., synthetic organic chemicals,

paints industry, lead acid batteries and lubricating oils etc., in connection with the pollution problems due to the establishment these industries.

Sri. R. Viswanatha Reddy, Surpanch, Tadigotla village while speaking on the occasion he requested the management to establish the industries systematically without any pollution problems to the water tanks and also demanded to enhance the compensation to the land losers.

Smt. B. Anasuyamma, r/o Ambakam Palle, requested the Government to settle land compensation issues immediately.


Then **The Joint Collector, YSR Dt** as requested the Environmental consultant of the proposed project to clarify the apprehensions on Environmental Issues raised by Sri C. Janardhan Reddy & Sri K. Ashok Kumar Reddy for reference of the public.

Sri. Vamsi Krishna, Environmental Consultant of the project, explained that all industries established in MIP shall comply the Environmental Standards stipulated by Central Pollution Control Board, (CPCB) / State Pollution Control Board strictly and no industry is allowed to discharge any water to outside the factory premises under any circumstances and the wastewater (effluents) generated from the respective industries will be treated at Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) system.

The Environmental Engineer, A.P. Pollution Control Board and Member Convener, Public Hearing Panel has also assured the public strict vigilance will be there on the industries, by the way of online monitoring systems etc., to assess pollution levels by the respective industries.

Then **The Joint Collector and Chairman of the Environmental Public Hearing Panel** while making conclusive remarks during the Environment Public hearing informed to the public that the main demand of land compensation issues will be examined.

On seeing no more suggestions / objections from the public The Joint Collector and the Chairman, Environmental Public Hearing Panel was concluded the Environmental Public Hearing. With the permission of the Chairman of the Public hearing panel the Environmental Public Hearing was ended with vote of thanks by Assistant Environmental Engineer, AP Pollution Control Board, Tirupati.
